4. First-aid measures

Inhalation If breathing is difficult, remove to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing.

Treat symptomatically. Treatment of SNRI (Seratonin and norepinephrine reuptake inhibitor) overdose may include the following: Gastrointestinal decontamination with activated charcoal is recommended. Maintenance of airway, breathing, circulatory status of the patient, in addition to ECG monitoring is warranted. Clinical assessment for signs that may indicate impending seizure activity or serotonin toxicity is important. Active measures should be taken to control muscular activity, lower temperature, and preserve renal function. Cyproheptadine may reverse serotonin

Remove from exposure. Remove contaminated clothing. For treatment advice, seek guidance from an occupational health physician or other licensed health-care provider familiar with workplace chemical exposures. In the United States, the national poison control center phone number is 1-800-222-1222. If person is not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen if available. 7. Handling and storage

Precautions for safe handling
