4. First-aid measures

Suction gastric contents through a nasogastric or orogastric tube. Control seizures and protect airway before initiating. Treat hypotension by infusing 10 - 20 mL/kg isotonic fluid. If hypotension persists, administer dopamine or norepinephrine. If inhaled, administer oxygen and assist ventilation as needed. Treat bronchospasm with inhaled beta2 agonist and oral or parenteral corticosteroids.

General information

Remove from exposure. Remove contaminated clothing. 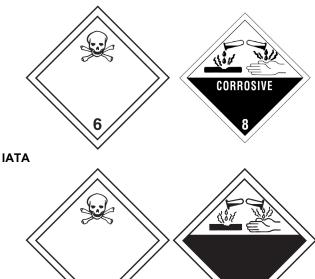
