4. First-aid measures

Inhalation If breathing is difficult, remove to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing.

For hypersensitivity reactions, manage anaphylaxis with establishment of patent airway, epinephrine, and diphenhydramine. For seizures, administer a benzodiazepine intravenously, followed by phenobarbital or propofol if the seizures recur. Monitor for hypotension, dysrhythmias, respiratory depression, and need for endotracheal intubation. Evaluate for hypoglycemia,
