Provide general supportive measures and treat symptomatically. Treatment of cephalosporin overdose may include the following: Administer charcoal as a slurry. Evaluate patients for signs and symptoms of hypersensitivity. Anaphylaxis should be managed with establishment of a patent airway, epinephrine, and diphenhydramine. For seizures, administer diazepam or lorazepam. If seizures recur, consider phenobarbital or propofol. Monitor for hypotension, dysrhythmias, respiratory depression, and need for endotracheal intubation. Evaluate for hypoglycemia, electrolyte disturbances, and hypoxia. Monitor fluid and electrolyte status in patients with severe vomiting and/or diarrhea. Monitor for renal and hematologic abnormalities. For coagulopathies, vitamin K has been beneficial.
